Dr. Oliver Sacks was a renowned neurologist, author, and educator, celebrated for his contributions to the understanding of the human brain and his ability to communicate complex scientific concepts to a broader audience. In doing so, he highlighted the profound impact of neurological disorders on human identity and experience.

Authors and colleagues often expressed their appreciation for Sacks' noted ability to communicate in a way that was accessible and engaging. Writers inscribed their books to Dr. Sacks because they saw him as a mentor, inspiration, or intellectual companion. Most of the inscriptions found in this list reflect the profound impact he had on the lives and work of those who shared his interest in the complexities of the human mind and the narratives that emerge from the intersection of science and personal experience.
